



ROUTINE VACCINE SCHEDULE

0-2 wk. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Hepatitis B #1

2 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
DTaP / IPV / HIB #1 (combination vaccine)
Rotavirus #1
Hepatitis B #2
Pneumococcal Conjugate #1

4 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
DTaP / IPV / HIB #2 (combination vaccine)
Rotavirus #2
Pneumococcal Conjugate #2

6 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Must be 6 months of age or older for vaccines
DTaP / IPV / HIB #3 (combination vaccine)
Rotavirus #3
Pneumococcal Conjugate #3

9 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Hepatitis B #3
Hematocrit (Iron level)

12 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Must be on or after the 12-month birthday for vaccines
MMR #1
Varicella #1
Pneumococcal Conjugate #4
Hepatitis A #1
TB questionnaire (PPD if needed)
Lead questionnaire

15 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
DTaP / IPV / HIB #4 (combination vaccine)

18 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Developmental Evaluation
Hepatitis A #2

24 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Developmental Evaluation

30 mos. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine (OPTIONAL)
Developmental Evaluation (if needed)
Catch up any missed vaccines

3 yrs. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Blood Pressure / Heart Rate
Catch up any missed vaccines

4 yrs. Well Baby Check-Up and Vaccine
Must be on or after the 4-year birthday for vaccines
DTaP #5
IPV #4
MMR #2
Varicella #2
Vision / Hearing
Blood Pressure / Heart Rate

Yearly Check-Ups (Children 5 yrs. & older)
Vision / Hearing
Blood Pressure / Heart Rate

10 -12 yrs. Vaccine
Tdap

11-12 yrs. Vaccine
Meningococcal Vaccine (Menactra #1)

16 -18 yrs. Vaccine
Meningococcal Vaccine (Menactra #2)

9 - 26 yrs. Vaccine
Human Papillomavirus (HPV)

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that children have regular dental exams starting at 3 yrs. of age and every 6 months, unless your pediatrician recommends sooner.

Influenza vaccine is recommended yearly for all children age 6 months and older (especially individuals with certain risk factors: asthma, diabetes, chronic lung disease, congenital heart disease). Please ask your pediatrician or nurse for more information.
